8.4 Center fire rifles which are chambered for the following cartridges, and ONLY the following cartridges, SHALL be allowed in Pistol Bay 6 ONLY.

- 1. 5.56x45mm NATO
- 2. .223 Remington
- 3. .300 Blackout (a/k/a .300 AAC or .300 AAC Blackout)

4. 7.62x<u>39</u>mm (i.e., the cartridge developed for use in the SKS and AK-47 families of rifles and other Soviet weapons systems – NOT 7.62x51mm NATO, .308 Winchester, 7.62x54R, or any other rifle cartridge which happens to fire a 7.62mm projectile).

- 5. 5.45x39mm
- 6. .30 Carbine
- 7. 7.92x33mm Kurz (a/k/a 8mm Kurz)
- 8. 30-30 Winchester

Persons using the Pistol Bays who are unsure whether their weapon fires one of these allowed cartridges SHALL verify the cartridge's allowance or disallowance under this rule with a Range Officer PRIOR to firing the weapon in Pistol Bay 6. Misunderstanding of the descriptions above SHALL NOT be an excuse for violating this rule.

Additionally, shotgun loads firing projectiles larger than No. 7 ¹/₂ birdshot, including buckshot and slugs, may also be used in Pistol Bay 6 ONLY.

Center fire rifles SHALL NOT be allowed in Pistol Bay 1 through Pistol Bay 5. Buckshot, slug, and other shotgun loads firing projectiles larger than No. 7 ¹/₂ birdshot SHAL NOT be allowed in Pistol Bay 1 through Pistol Bay 5. All other Pistol Bay Rules SHALL apply.

8.4.1 In addition to being restricted to Pistol Bay 6 ONLY, center fire rifles and shotgun loads firing projectiles larger than No. 7 ½ birdshot SHALL NOT be fired at ANY steel targets of any kind whatsoever under any circumstances, INCLUDING personally owned steel targets as well as WLGC-owned and WLPS-owned steel.

8.4.2 EXCEPTION: During organized practical shooter matches or other events under the direct supervision of a match director, a match range officer, or an instructor specifically permitted to hold a class on Club property, Pistol Bay 1 through Pistol Bay 6 may allow center fire rifles and/or shotgun projectiles larger than No. 7 ½ shot and may allow the firing of such weapons at steel targets.

For all purposes under Rule 8.4 and all of its subsections, the term "center fire rifle" SHAL INCLUDE any large format pistol chambered for center fire rifle cartridges, as well as any other firearm whatsoever that fires a center fire rifle cartridge.

IN BAY 6, AND BAY 6 **ONLY**, THE FOLLOWING CARTRIDGES ARE <u>ALLOWED</u>:

1. 5.56x45mm NATO

2. .223 Remington

3. .300 Blackout (a/k/a .300 AAC or .300 AAC Blackout)

4. 7.62x<u>**39**</u>mm (i.e., the cartridge fired by weapons in the AK-47 and SKS families, and NOT any other cartridge firing a 7.62mm bullet)

5. 5.45x39mm

6. .30 Carbine

7. 7.92x33mm Kurz (a/k/a 8mm Kurz)

8. 30-30 Winchester

9. Shotgun shells containing any size shot, including buck and slugs

IF IT IS A RIFLE OR SHOTGUN CARTRIDGE AND IS NOT ON THIS LIST, YOU **MAY NOT** USE IT IN BAY 6. IF YOU ARE NOT SURE IF YOUR AMMUNITION QUALIFIES, **DO NOT FIRE IT IN THIS BAY** UNTIL YOU HAVE CONFIRMED WITH A RANGE OFFICER THAT IT IS ALLOWED.

ALL RIFLE CARTRIDGES, AND SHOTGUN PROJECTILES LARGER THAN NO. 7 ½ SHOT, REMAIN PROHIBITED IN BAYS 1 THROUGH 5.

RIFLE CARTRIDGES, SHOT LARGER THAN 7 ½, AND SLUGS SHALL NOT BE FIRED AT STEEL TARGETS UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES – THIS <u>INCLUDES</u> <u>PERSONALLY OWNED STEEL</u> AS WELL AS THE CLUB'S AND WLPS'S STEEL.
